Dear Supporters,

As we reflect on the past year, we are proud of the progress NextUp RVA staff has made in implementing the five-year strategic plan. Significant investments have been made in the provider network, ensuring they have the necessary resources and support to deliver high-quality out-of-school time programs. NextUp significantly increased access and reach of expanded-learning opportunities for Richmond's youth.

We have strengthened our partnership with the City of Richmond to facilitate the distribution of funds to over 40 community-based organizations through the Positive Youth Development Fund Initiative, providing necessary support to over 700 youth in Richmond. We have also provided professional development opportunities for our provider network, helping them to improve their organizational structure and capacity.

In addition, we have crafted ways for youth to explore their future career options by aligning the providers within our network to Virginia's Department of Education (VDOE) Career Clusters to ensure the providers offer programs that align with student talent pathways selection.

We also continue to enhance data collection to support out-of-school time in Richmond, NextUp's EXpanded-learning Information System (NEXIS), giving providers access to essential information regarding their organization, helping them better understand their youth's needs.

We are grateful for the support of our system by donors, partners, and community members. Together, we are creating a brighter future for Richmond's youth.












