Youth who participated in programs for **30 or more days** saw improvement in **attendance**, **behavior**, **and their math and English grades**.\*

96%	of youth believe that attending program(s) has helped them find out what I'm good at doing and what they like to do.
93%	of youth have fun when they're in their programs.
93%	of youth believe that attending program(s) has helped them to make new friends.
<b>82</b> %	of youth believe that attending program(s) has helped them do better in school.

\*Data represents the RPS youth that participated in coordinated programs at one of NextUp's core model middle schools (Albert Hill, Boushall, Lucille Brown, Henderson, and River City).

<b>65</b> %	of youth improved or maintained positive attendance.
80%	of youth improved or maintained positive behavior (decrease or zero behavior infractions)
96%	of youth achieved a final grade of C or above in English.
91%	of youth achieved a final grade of C or above in math.
